

Taipei National University of the Arts Regulations for Cross-school Double Majors

Approved by the 2nd Academic Affairs Meeting in the 1st Semester of Academic Year 2011 on December 13, 2011 Ratified by Ministry of Education Letter Tai Gao (2) No. 1000238418, dated January 3, 2012

Article 1	<p>The Regulations are provided by the Taipei National University of the Arts (hereafter the University) in order to expand students' fields of study and inter-school exchange.</p> <p>The cross-school double majors refer to students of the University who wish to pursue a second major in departments/programs of a different nature offered by collaborating universities (hereinafter referred to as "Other Universities") or students of Other Universities who wish to pursue a second major in departments/programs of a different nature offered by the University. The nature of the majors shall be determined by respective departments/programs of the University and Other Universities.</p>
Article 2	<p>The cross-school double majors shall take the form of bilateral exchange between the University and Other Universities. Both sides must sign agreements for arranging cross-school double major programs.</p>
Article 3	<p>Students who wish to apply for cross-school double majors must receive approval from respective departments/programs of the University and Other Universities.</p>

Article 4	The student status of the University's students taking a second major at Other Universities is governed by the University's regulations; the student status of Other Universities' students taking a second major at the University is governed by the Other Universities' regulations.
Article 5	The courses and credit fees for the double majors shall be determined under the agreement signed between the universities involved.
Article 6	<p>Cross-school double majors students of undergraduate programs must complete all credits required by their original departments, as well as all courses designed specifically for the second major at the Other Universities.</p> <p>The credit and graduation requirements for cross-school double major students of masters and PhD programs will be governed under the related regulations of both universities.</p>
Article 7	Cross-school double major students, upon passing the graduation evaluation by their original departments/programs and the second major departments/programs, shall receive graduation certificates on which the double majors, and the names of the departments/programs and universities where they have obtained the degrees shall be indicated.
Article 8	Provided undergraduate students pursuing cross-school double majors have completed the graduation credits required by their original departments but have yet to complete the cross-school second major courses and credits, they may apply for cross-school minor degrees if the credits they have received from their second-major programs fulfill the minor degree requirements at Other Universities and if they obtain approval from collaborating universities. If the credits do not meet the minor degree requirements of Other Universities, chairpersons of their own departments shall determine whether the second-major credits that the students have

	<p>received will be accepted as credits for optional courses of their own departments.</p> <p>Additionally, as cross-school minors do not apply to students of masters and PhD programs, the second-major credits they have received from their uncompleted cross-school double majors can only be accepted as credits for optional courses.</p>
Article 9	Any circumstances not stipulated in the Regulations shall be governed by relevant statutes of the students' own universities, Regulations for Double Majors and relevant laws.
Article 10	The Regulations shall be implemented after approval by the Academic Affairs Meeting, and they shall be reported to the Ministry of Education for reference. The same procedure shall apply to future revisions.
